Cittadellarte aims to:

- develop new ways of thinking and new paradigms within various areas of society to guide the activities towards a more responsible society
- emphasize the importance of creativity and art in the centre of our societies
- initiate and lead sustainable example projects, in dynamic collaboration with external partners, that exchange experiences, inspire others in their own activities and can become models to be adopted elsewhere
- share those ideas, concepts, projects and activities and train people to become activators themselves in the process of creating a more responsible society
- establish networks of collaboration and activation

Autre(s)pARTs

In July 2000, the Cassandre review wrote for the national newspaper Libération a call entitled "Let art live", signed by many artistic, cultural or political actors. This call considered a need "to found action and *think tanks* around the artistic practices in bond with the populations".

Following this idea, Autre(s)pARTs association was created by carriers of experiences on

individual and collective initiatives whose artistic and cultural projects were the subject and still make debate, especially in the field of public policies.

After a year of awareness of their respective projects, basic discussions on the direction of their regrouping, catch of time necessary to the installation of an operation, from now on it is a question of opening dynamics for both action and reflection to the largest amount of people.
